

“I am currently on a motorcycle mechanic course at Weltec and am visually impaired and was given the Jordy by Adaptive Technology Solutions for a trial period to see if it would help with my vision to see small items, such as part numbers, in difficult areas and while working on the bike. I found it to be useful at looking at small parts and diagrams. The Jordy was then purchased through my Training Support Funds managed by Workbridge, an Employment Agency for People with Disabilities. What I have found good about the Jordy is that it allows me to look at small parts or wiring diagrams and I can have my hands free to do other tasks or that I can look at part numbers on something that I wouldn't normally be able to see. The best thing about the Jordy is its manoeuvrability and that it doesn't matter what size an object I put under it is or that something is in an awkward place I can still get at it and this gives me the freedom to do my work more efficiently.”
